We celebrated all of YOU and the wonderful work you have accomplished during 2023 at our annual Volunteer Recognition Dinner in May at the Harriet Tubman Underground Railroad State Park pavilion. Volunteers at Blackwater NWR are involved in everything from staffing the Visitor Center and maintaining the butterfly garden, to leading birding tours, surveying wintering waterfowl, monitoring nest boxes, building accessible hunt blinds, and so much more! During 2023, 145 volunteers contributed 9,219 hours of volunteer service to the refuge!

Blackwater National Wildlife Refuge's 2023 Volunteer of the Year Award went to Ellie Ludvigsen. Ellie was instrumental in getting the Roving Refuge Volunteer program up and running, aimed at enhancing the visitor experience on the refuge.
